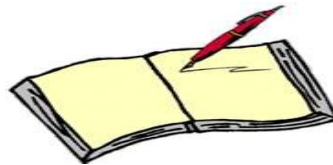

Absentee Voting - Residents who do not believe they will be able to attend the Residents' Association Meeting may pick up an Absentee Ballot at the Front Desk April 30th-May 4th from 9:00am-7:00pm. Residents will sign next to their name on the master list of all Residents. Ballots must be returned in a sealed envelop to the Front Desk between April 30th-May 7th from 9:00am-7:00pm. When returning the ballot, the Resident must initial next to their earlier signature on that master list. The sealed envelopes will be placed in the secured ballot box that will be used May 8th.

Voting at the May 8th Annual Meeting - There will be a designated table in the Marketplace staffed by GSVE Leadership from 1:00-3:00pm that day. Residents will sign next to their name on the master voting list, be given a ballot and instructed to go to one of the several tables nearby "stocked" with pens, mark the ballot and place it in the ballot box. During the meeting, Leadership will count the ballots and at the end of the meeting the Nominating Committee will report the results. It is hoped that Residents will vote throughout the 1:00-3:00pm time span in order to facilitate counting of ballots without a "log jam" just before the 3:00pm meeting time.

Power Washing & Window Cleaning

Fluorescent Light Bulbs

Compact fluorescent lights (CFLs) contain a very, very small amount of mercury, need to be cleaned up correctly when broken.

Information on the proper disposal of broken CFLs can be found on the Maintenance page of the Resident's Website. If you do not access the website, a hard copy of cleanup instructions is available at the Front Desk, please ask the receptionist.

Compost Collection

It's time to begin compost collection. Collection time will be Friday morning at 6:30am. Therefore, if you are a late sleeper, please put your bucket out on Thursday night. Buckets put out later than this will not be emptied. If you already have a bucket, you can begin collecting approved wastes. If you need a bucket, please call or e-mail the Grounds Department and we will provide one. Please make sure that there are no wrappers or other garbage in the bucket. *Materials in plastic bags or cans lined with plastic bags will not be collected.*

Information on what to compost:

IN THE COMPOST

- Coffee Grounds
- Egg Shells
- Fruit/Peels/Rinds
- Vegetables/Peels/Rinds
- Yard Waste
- Tea Bags

IN THE GARBAGE

- Bones
- Paper* and Paper Towels
- Cardboard*
- Meat/Chicken/Fish Scraps
- Dairy Products
- Oil/Dressing/Peanut Butter

- Please put compostable waste directly into the bucket, no plastic bags!
- If there are waste items you are unsure of please ask before putting it into the compost stream.
- The finer the materials are chopped or crushed the faster the decomposition will be!

*These materials should be put in recycling bins

Mosquitoes versus Craneflies

Many of you indicated that you are concerned about mosquitoes. While it would seem that this campus was a great place for mosquitoes to breed, there are actually no more here than anywhere else in the area. Mosquitoes prefer to breed in warm, dark, stagnant water. Our ditches and retention ponds are poor breeding sites for mosquitoes because they are flushed each time it rains, and are filled with frogs and other predators which feed on insects and their larvae.

Lately there has been a preponderance of the creature seen above, commonly mistaken for a mosquito. This is actually a cranefly. While somewhat intimidating, craneflies cannot bite and are, therefore, harmless to people.

News from Sodexo...

You will be seeing new menus mid-May in the Marketplace and Pub with a variety of items, some Resident favorites and new additions. They have already been reviewed and approved by the Lifestyle Committee and Leadership. Please look for further details on Village TV.

We continue to move forward, but with some challenges along the way which is typical with any transition, especially between food service contractors. We have also had to adjust with some of the serving staff leaving for college and participating in after school sports, activities and outings. Hiring additional and replacement staff has been a daunting task with many regulatory requirements for CCRCs.
